The Basics Routine Maintenance. There are a couple simple things to keep an eye on in order to keep your spa optimal for regular use. First off, the most important thing is to use your basic senses. Does your water look clear. Does it smell funny. Does the water feel clean. If you notice anything out of the ordinary about your water, you may need to stay on top of your routine maintenance for your spa. If you notice any leaves or large debris in your water, use a skimmer to scoop up anything you can see. If you notice any smells or scale floating in the water, continue in the article to find out how to remedy these issues. A good thing to regularly check is water chemistry. This is one of the most important things to keep track of when maintaining your spa. A couple test strips or pH test kit are a must have to make sure that your spa water is healthy. The ideal pH balance of your spa should be hovering around the 7.27.8 range. Any lower and your water is too acidic. It is important to regularly check pH because any imbalance can hinder the sanitizing agents and promote bacterial growth or cause cloudy or scale buildup in the water. Once your pH balances are in check, but you are still noticing issues with your water flow and filter efficiency, it may be time to take a look at your filter. A good rule of thumb is to remove and clean your filter biweekly to ensure minimal blockages and maximize the life of your filter. A simple cleaning can be done with a soft brush and hose to dig out any large particles and clear the filter for better flow. A deep filter clean is great to pair with a routine water replacement for your spa. Quarterly, you should drain and refill the water in your hot tub. While you do this it is a good idea to do a thorough cleaning of your filter. Instead of just rinsing the filter out with water, we recommend soaking the filter overnight in cleaning agents to maximize filter health. Always be sure to do a final water rinse and dry of the filter before reinstallation. Replacement Annually. With regular spa use, it is recommended to do a full filter replacement annually. After regular cleaning, the filter media beings to break down over time. Annually a full replacement is recommended to ensure a long life for all other parts of the spa. Nothing can substitute a brand new filter, and it will feel as if your spa has been completely revived. The water will be cleaner and will flow better overall. 



It is a small panel with four buttons that control certain spa functions, such as primary or additional jets, TV, or lights Figure 10. It conveniently puts the control of several spa functions at your fingertips without having to get up. They allow you to divert water through jets from one side of the spa to the other, or in most cases from floor jets to wall jets. This is accomplished by rotating the diverter knob to the left counterclockwise, decreasing the amount of water flow through a section of jets. Drain your spa completely as described in the instructions above. Remove drain plugs from the front of the pumps. Disconnect the unions from both sides of the pump. The key to clean, clear, and safe water is to fully understand how spa water reacts to users, system operation and chemical use. Add 8oz of Cal Spas "Liquid Filter Cleaner" to the bucket of water. This is true for ALL hot tubs and not specific to Coast Spas. If you are an owner of any brand of hot tub, you will want to maintain your hot tub in order to keep the components in great shape. Your local Coast Spas dealer will also be able to test and advise you on proper maintenance techniques and requirements. What do I do Ensure that you select the document that represents your hot tub. The establishment from which you purchased your hot tub is knowledgable and may even be able to assist you to correct the problem over the phone. If any replacement parts are needed, there is a good chance they will have them in stock. Need help finding your nearest dealer. We are always here to help a Coast Spas hot tub owner, no matter the age of your tub. Note that Coast Spas is the manufacturer and distributes products to independent dealers around the world. Manufactured January June 2015 Manufactured July Dec 2015 To ensure maximum water quality at all times, you should replace the filter cartridge every six months, or earlier as necessary. The filter cartridge is designed to be thrown away. Attempts to reuse the filter cartridge may result in the rerelease of unwanted particles back into the hot tub The frequency will depend on a number of variables including frequency of use, number of bathers and attention paid to the water quality maintenance. You will know it is time for a change when you can no longer get the normal feel or sparkle to the water, even though the key water balance measurements are all within the

recommended ranges. All pillows have plugs within the pillow itself. To remove the pillow, grab the bottom edge firmly and pull outward. This will allow the pillows to popout from the receptacle in the spa shell. To reinstall the pillow you will align the pillow plug with the receptacle. Failure to do so may damage the spa pillows. We recommend that pillows be washed each time you drain you spa. Generally dirt and stains will not adhere to the surface. To properly clean the surface, we recommend wiping it with a soft damp cloth or sponge using household soap or liquid detergent and rinsing thoroughly with fresh water. Harsh chemicals should never be used on acrylic surfaces. Damage to the shell due to the use of harsh chemicals is not covered under the warranty. Extreme heat could cause damage to the acrylic surface. This action may induce an electrical short in the hot tub's electrical equipment. With proper care and maintenance, your cedar cabinet should maintain its beauty for many years. Coast Spas recommends touchup or restaining of the cabinet every three to four years depending on your environment. Contact your Dealer for restaining procedures. This cabinet is manufactured so that it won't crack, peel, blister or delaminate even after prolonged exposure to the elements.

We recommend wiping the cabinet with a soft damp cloth or sponge using household soap or liquid detergent and rinsing with fresh water thoroughly. DO NOT use abrasive cleansers or material as this may damage the surface. We recommend lightly brushing the cabinet with a SOFT bristle brush to remove any dirt or stains. For more information on the care of your Slate cabinet, please contact your Coast Spas Dealer. We recommend wiping the cabinet with a soft damp cloth or sponge using household soap or liquid detergent and rinsing with fresh water thoroughly. There are also many stainless steel appliance cleaners on the market today that will help in the care and maintenance of the stainless steel cabinet. DO NOT use abrasive cleansers or material as this may damage the surface. Your cover needs to be cleaned and conditioned because vinyl can be dry and become brittle, spoiling your spa's appearance. Dry, brittle vinyl can also tear at the seams and stress points. Quality materials, internal sewn reinforcing and careful workmanship can only go so far against the ravages of Mother Nature. See the specific Warranty card enclosed with your cover for further details. Nor should you place any heavy object on top of the cover as this may damage the structure. Your Coast Spas Dealer carries a wide variety of care and maintenance products. Choose a pleasant day each month to remove your cover from the spa and lay it on a fl at surface accessible by garden hose. Douse the cover with a healthy amount of water from the hose or a bucket to rinse away loose dirt or debris. Using a soft bristle brush and a mild solution of dishwashing liquid about one teaspoon of detergent to two gallons of water, and with a gentle circular motion, scrub the cover clean. Be careful not to let any areas of the cover dry before they're thoroughly rinsed. Now apply the vinyl conditioner as directed on the container. Massage the conditioner into the cover in a gentle but firm manner.

Before replacing the cover on your spa, wipe and rinse any dirt from the bottom of the cover. When you are ready, put the cover on the spa. Use sparingly, then immediately apply conditioner to that area. This warranty specifically covers leaks from the jet fittings, drain fittings, internal plumbing, filter canister and light lens.
